SENIOR ADVOCATE

Wauconda Township supports filing applications for the Benefit Access Program.

This program provides a discount on the annual renewal of the license plate sticker for one car two years in a row and a Ride Free transit pass with the RTA. To qualify, one must be at least 65 years old or under 65 and on Disability, live in the state of Illinois, and meet the criteria of no more than \$33,562 gross income in the previous year when filing for a one person household or \$44,533 for filing for a two person household.

We have SHIP counseling available. The Senior Health Insurance Program assists individuals who are aging into or who are already enrolled in the Medicare system. SHIP counselors provide

individual, unbiased counseling to Medicare eligible beneficiaries to help them understand health care costs and coverage and to make the most appropriate choice for their health care needs.

The township maintains a medical equipment lending closet. Wheelchairs, walkers, rollators, shower chairs, transfer benches, commodes, toilet risers, canes, and bed rails are taken as donations and lent at no charge to people recovering from surgeries or injuries. These items may be borrowed for the duration of recovery or until clients receive a Medicare covered replacement.

INFORMATION FROM THE WAUCONDA TOWNSHIP CLERK

With many new people moving to Wauconda Township and current residents making changes, you may be wondering what residents should do and where you can find more information. I thought it would be helpful to share some important information. As always residents can visit www.lakecountyil.gov to use as a great source to access information and services. You will be able to find vital records such as birth, marriage license, death, election information and property taxes. If you do not have access to the internet or a computer, you can call 847-377-2400.

Where and When I Can Vote or Register to Vote?

The local places where you can register to vote is Wauconda Township Hall, Wauconda Library, Wauconda Village Hall and the Lake County Clerk's office located at 18 N. County St., Room 101,

Waukegan. You can also register using the Illinois Voter Application on the Illinois State Board of Elections website. (You will need a valid Illinois drivers license or state ID)


If you are voting for the first time, you must vote in person and not vote by mail, unless the person first provides sufficient proof of identity, and the County Clerk verifies the person's proof of identity. People who apply to register to vote by mail but provide inadequate proof of identity to the County Clerk shall be notified by the County Clerk that the registration has not been fully completed. That person will remain ineligible to vote by mail or in person until such proof is presented. If you choose to register to vote by mailing in an application, your mail-in form must be postmarked prior to the close of the registration period.

The Consolidated Election will take place on April 4, 2023. For additional information, please visit LakeCountyClerk.info for all election information.

NEW, GENTLY USED AND WORN

It is estimated that nearly 85% of all clothing and textiles end up in landfills in the U.S. today. Over 32 billion pounds of clothing is thrown out every year. The EPA estimates that the average person throws away 70 pounds of clothing each year, and much of this is being thrown away within 12 months of being made. Textile and clothing waste is the fastest growing category of waste in the U.S. waste stream and a significant problem in our country and around the globe. It is estimated that anywhere from 5 to 10% of all waste that is sent to municipal landfills is comprised of textiles. These items are often very dense and consume significant landfill space. We know that the current situation calls for us to look for a solution with ethical, responsible alternatives.

With those statistics in mind, a need to look for new solutions, and a goal to increase reuse

and recycle, SWALCO established and offers a community-wide program where clothing and textiles can be collected for reuse and recycling. This program not only diverts items from landfills, assists our local community, but it also supports our greater environment and planet beyond. The program will accept new, gently used, or unwanted/worn, women's, men's and children's clothing and textiles. All fabrics will be accepted. Even clothes or textiles with stains or holes, along with those notorious single socks, will be accepted. The great news is nearly 95% of the materials collected will be repurposed, reused or recycled.

Wauconda Township is a drop off location for textiles and shoes! We hope you'll join us to make positive changes for our local community and our planet, and support these efforts.

WARMER WEATHER IS ON ITS WAY!

Lake County Property Tax bills for Tax Year 2022 payable in 2023 should be mailed the 1st week of May. The bill is payable in two equal installments. The first installment is normally due the 1st week of June and the second installment is due the 1st week of September. Please note, Lake County residents receive a single tax bill for both installments. It is also a good time to review your exemptions & verify you are receiving all the exemptions you are eligible for. Please contact our office if you have any questions regarding eligibility.

For those with the Disabled Person, Disabled Veteran & Senior Freeze exemptions, please remember that these exemptions need to be renewed every year and if you have not done so, please take a moment to complete the application online or come to our office with the needed paperwork and we can assist with the application process.

As a property owner, it is essential to be aware of the upcoming quadrennial (QUAD), also known as a general re-assessment year. The QUAD year is the first year in a four-year cycle and will provide the base value for the three subsequent years. The Assessor's office will utilize property characteristic data and analyze sales from the three years prior to the lien date of January 1, 2023 in order to determine the fair cash value for each property in the township.

Think of the QUAD year as a reset – all values are new and not based on any previous year's valuation. If you successfully appealed before the Lake County Board of Review, those reductions will not carry forward into the QUAD year. The QUAD is also a reapportionment – value will shift throughout the township, throughout different property types and uses. The assessed value apportions the property tax burden and shifts in valuation will also shift the tax burden. We anticipate the 2023 Assessment notice to be mailed during the month of July.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Winter is finally coming to an end. Soon we will be converting our fleet from winter operations to summer road project operations. For your information:

- Right of way mowing will start closer to Memorial Day.
- Free mulch will be available at the Wauconda Road District building until October while supplies last.
- If you are planning to repave your driveway this year, please call us well in advance in case your culvert needs to be replaced. To schedule a free culvert inspection call 847-526-8085.
- Brush pickup will only be done on the second Monday of each month May October. Brush should be placed in the right of way no later than 7am on the day of pickup as our equipment will only make one pass through all neighborhoods. Brush should be placed with cut ends facing the street. No metal, garbage, weeds, leaves or yard waste will be picked up. Storm damage will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis. Please note, no yard waste will be picked up.





Please call the road district office if you see any roadway hazards or if you have any questions or concerns. It's always a pleasure to serve Wauconda Township and working together we can keep our roadways safe and clean.
